Hanson Nature Center Grand Opening!

The big day finally arrived! On Saturday, July 13th, we officially dedicated the Hanson Nature Center! Fundraising for the Center began in 2018 and construction was delayed for a bit by Covid. But, after 6 years, we can happily say that Winnebago County now has a nature center!

Although we didn't have any professionally-constructed displays up yet, people were happy with the exhibits that we had developed inhouse. As time goes on, we will continue to put up new exhibits whenever we can, and we will be hiring professionals to work on future displays, as well. In addition to the indoor displays, people are also welcome to walk the prairie surrounding the Center. And there are wonderful benches on the spacious deck that visitors can use to relax and reflect.

A student asked recently when the Center will be finished. Our hope is never! We will always be improving things and creating new exhibits so that you have new things to see and learn about each time you visit. And, as time goes on, we will also be enhancing the area around the Center, including erecting nesting boxes and bird feeders and putting up outdoor exhibits.





Now that the Hanson Nature Center is open, we have set visiting hours. The Center is open on Mondays and Wednesdays from 10:00 AM-1:00 PM and on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1:00-4:00 PM. We have also been open on a few select Saturdays as well, but we probably won't be open much on the weekends now until spring. We are also open whenever someone is working there, which is actually most of the time, or by appointment. Just call us if you'd like to visit during "off" hours and we'll make time for you!

Fall, 2024, Events at the Hanson Nature Center

With the opening of our new nature center, we now have a wonderful location to host programs and traveling exhibits. So, this past fall, we began doing just that! Through the month of September, we hosted a traveling wolf exhibit from the International Wolf Center in Ely, MN. The display showcased six different taxidermy mounts, along with fascinating information about the various species of wolves, their habits, and their status throughout North America. Along with the display, we also arranged for the Wolf Center to present a Zoom program entitled, "Wolf 101." During that program, an educator from the Wolf Center presented facts about wolves and answered questions from the public. Both the exhibit and the Zoom program were very well-received!

Then, in October, we worked with the Corner Pumpkin Patch up the road to host our first "Pumpkins and Prairies Palooza" event! Over 300 people showed up to enjoy events and activities at both the pumpkin patch and the nature center. At the nature center, kids got to make native plant seed balls as well as jack-o-lantern tree cookies. And, in addition to the displays at the nature center, everyone enjoyed apple cider, apple nachos, and popcorn. We also provided havrides back and forth through the prairie between the center and the pumpkin patch. Thanks to the success of the event, don't be surprised if you see it scheduled again for next fall!

We want to thank everyone who attended these events and helped to make them so successful. In the future, we look forward to providing more such events at the Hanson Nature Center!

BUILD YOUR OWN FISHING ROD CLASS FRIDAY, JANUARY 24TH-SATURDAY, JANUARY 25TH HANSON NATURE CENTER

This will be a two-session class, with the first session beginning at 6:00 PM Friday evening, and the second session running from 2:00-5:00 Saturday afternoon. Participants will need to buy a fishing rod kit from <u>mudhole.com</u>; otherwise, the class itself is free. Registration is required, though, by <u>contacting Rick</u> by Friday, January 10th, at which time he'll help you decide which kit will be right for you.



Come join us for an evening of stargazing! Naturalist Lisa Ralls will lead an informal tour of the winter nighttime sky, helping people to identify some of the brighter stars and constellations visible this time of year. Afterwards, come inside to enjoy a hot cup of hot chocolate or apple cider! This program will be free of charge and there is no need to preregister.
